

²³Am I a God near by, says the LORD, and not a God far off? ²⁴Who can hide in secret places so that I cannot see them? says the LORD. Do I not fill heaven and earth? says the LORD. ²⁵I have heard what the prophets have said who prophesy lies in my name, saying, "I have dreamed, I have dreamed!" ²⁶How long? Will the hearts of the prophets ever turn back—those who prophesy lies, and who prophesy the deceit of their own heart? ²⁷They plan to make my people forget my name by their dreams that they tell one another, just as their ancestors forgot my name for Baal. ²⁸Let the prophet who has a dream tell the dream, but let the one who has my word speak my word faithfully. What has straw in common with wheat? says the LORD. ²⁹Is not my word like fire, says the LORD, and like a hammer that breaks a rock in pieces?

Now I say to you, 'You are gods, * and all of you children of the Most High; ⁷Nevertheless, you shall die like mortals, * and fall like any prince."" ⁸Arise, O God, and rule the earth, * for you shall take all nations for your own.

SECOND READING: Hebrews 11:29–12:2

Reader A Reading from Paul's letter to the Hebrews.

²⁹By faith the people passed through the Red Sea as if it were dry land, but when the Egyptians attempted to do so they were drowned. ³⁰By faith the walls of Jericho fell after they had been encircled for seven days. ³¹By faith Rahab the prostitute did not perish with those who were disobedient, because she had received the spies in peace.

³²And what more should I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets—³³who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, ³⁴quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. ³⁵Women received their dead by resurrection. Others were tortured, refusing to accept release, in order to obtain a better resurrection. ³⁶Others suffered mocking and flogging, and even chains and imprisonment. ³⁷They were stoned to death, they were sawn in two, they were killed by the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, persecuted, tormented—³⁸of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, and in caves and holes in the ground.

³⁹Yet all these, though they were commended for their faith, did not receive what was promised, ⁴⁰since God had provided something better so that they would not, apart from us, be made perfect.

¹²⁻¹Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, ²looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.



The Great Thanksgiving



Music Notes by Ray Urwin


Today's Offertory music is Jay Ungar's *Ashokan Farewell*, written for the Ashokan Music and Dance Camps that the composer and his spouse have run at the Ashokan Center in the Catskill Mountains since 1980. Written "in the style of a Scottish lament," its familiar, plaintive strains were later heard by millions as the musical centerpiece of the Grammy Award winning score for Ken Burn's PBS miniseries *The Civil War*.

Francis Jackson, composer of today's Hymn of Praise, was for many years Organist and Director of Music at York Minster, the largest Gothic cathedral in Northern Europe. He died earlier this year at age 104. He was succeeded at York by Philip Moore, composer of today's Voluntary. It depicts the repeated note pattern of church bells (carillons), best heard in the pedals. Such repeated patterns, called ostinatos, have a long history in music.

August Update from the Rector Search Committee

The Rector Search Committee is in the process of scheduling one-hour Zoom interviews with applicants for St. Michael's rector position. The hope is to complete interviews in August then nominate three finalists. The diocese will conduct detailed background checks on the three finalists. Background checks take up to six weeks to complete. After that, the Rector Search Committee will connect with the Vestry and relay our thoughts about the three.
