⁴When I remember you in my prayers, I always thank my God ⁵because I hear of your love for all the saints and your faith toward the Lord Jesus. ⁶I pray that the sharing of your faith may become effective when you perceive all the good that we may do for Christ. ⁷I have indeed received much joy and encouragement from your love, because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed through you, my brother.

⁸For this reason, though I am bold enough in Christ to command you to do your duty, ⁹yet I would rather appeal to you on the basis of love—and I, Paul, do this as an old man, and now also as a prisoner of Christ Jesus. ¹⁰I am appealing to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I have become during my imprisonment. ¹¹Formerly he was useless to you, but now he is indeed useful both to you and to me. ¹²I am sending him, that is, my own heart, back to you. ¹³I wanted to keep him with me, so that he might be of service to me in your place during my imprisonment for the gospel; ¹⁴but I preferred to do nothing without your consent, in order that your good deed might be voluntary and not something forced. ¹⁵Perhaps this is the reason he was separated from you for a while, so that you might have him back forever, ¹⁶no longer as a slave but more than a slave, a beloved brother—especially to me but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord.

¹⁷So if you consider me your partner, welcome him as you would welcome me. ¹⁸If he has wronged you in any way, or owes you anything, charge that to my account. ¹⁹I, Paul, am writing this with my own hand: I will repay it. I say nothing about your owing me even your own self.

²⁰Yes, brother, let me have this benefit from you in the Lord! Refresh my heart in Christ.

²¹Confident of your obedience, I am writing to you, knowing that you will do even more than I say.

Music Notes from Ray Urwin

Today's Prelude and Offertory are by the Vierne brothers, Louis and René. Louis, the older of the two, was the renowned and longtime organist of Notre Dame. He wrote much organ music, and is one of several famous blind organists in music history (Louis Braille, the inventor of the famous blind reading system, was also an organist). Louis died, as he always wished, at the console of his beloved Notre Dame organ, while playing a recital. His student, page turner and assistant that night was the soon to be famous organist/composer Maurice Duruflé, who finished the recital. I have heard from many colleagues that when practicing late at night for their upcoming recitals they have felt the presence and sometimes even seen and heard Vierne's ghost, strolling the aisles, while practicing! The old console is preserved and on view in one of the church's towers. Louis' younger brother René was a very promising organist and composer, organist at Notre Dame des Champs in Paris in the years before World War 1. He went into the French military almost the day the war began in 1914 and survived most of the war, but was killed in action in May 1918, a few months before the Armistice. Louis lost his eldest son as well as his brother in the Great War, and had a very difficult and tragic life and career in many other ways. The music of both Viernes is highly chromatic with surprising harmonic changes, typical of the early 20th century.
