


The Great Thanksgiving

Music Notes from Ray Urwin

A few years ago I researched hymn texts, anthems and organ music about St. Michael, in preparation for these Sundays. I learned that there is an archangel Michael in Judaism and Islam as well as Christianity. I also learned that except for a few Christmas hymns and others, there are very few texts mentioning angels in general, and even fewer mentioning Michael. The texts we are singing today are not all old - the Offertory Hymn text was written only in 2000. But most of the Christian texts I found are 19th-century translations from the original Latin - inspired by the dramatic imagery in today's second reading of thousands of angels led by Michael in combat with dragons (think of the Prince fighting with the Maleficent/dragon in Sleeping Beauty!). These texts are typically Romantic - often hyperbolic, exaggerated and overly dramatic by today's standards, with now-antiquated grammar and vocabulary. Today we'll sing two of the better Michael and angel texts I found, using familiar tunes. The Offertory music is a striking setting of a Celtic text by American composer and arranger Alice Parker, commissioned by another St. Michael's for their patronal celebration. The Prelude piece is a rarely sung setting of a Michael text by the Slovenian composer Jakob Handl, also known as Gallus, the Latin word for "Rooster" (as is Handl in German)! His music is wide-ranging and eclectic, a rich blend of conservative and innovative styles with daring harmonic progressions, as you'll hear. His motet *Ecce quomodo moritur justus* was later used by Handel more than a century later in a funeral anthem for English royalty. The Communion music is an organ piece based on a plainsong hymn for Michael's feast day by Marcel Dupré, organist for many years at the famed St. Sulpice Church in Paris.

Safety and Security Task Force

Houses of worship are meant to be places of shelter, reflection, and peace, where strangers are welcome. But the recent string of high-profile mass shootings in the U.S. is a reminder violence can happen anywhere. Saint Michael & All Angels is joining houses of worship across the country in taking precautionary steps by forming a Safety and Security Task Force led by the Rev. Dr. Barbara Stewart.

Over the summer months, meetings were held with the Orange County Intelligence Assessment Center (OCIAC) and the Orange County Sheriff's Office. A vulnerability assessment of St. Mike's campus focused on physical site security, access/entry control, and integration of existing security features with recommended procedural additions to improve overall security and preparedness.

Creating a space that is both safe and welcoming is possible! The assessment identified several options likely to lower St. Mike's general risk level. There are two dozen precautions we can take immediately at little to no cost. There are high-cost solutions too, but several non-profit security grant programs can be leveraged to cover funding. The parish task force will evaluate and prioritize the assessment recommendations.

Rector Search | Consult with St. Wilfrid's

Senior Warden Kirt Smoot and Treasurer Jeff Eichinger from St. Wilfrid of York Episcopal Church in Huntington Beach joined a recent St Mike's Finance Commission to share their experience and expertise. St. Wilfrid's recently completed a successful rector search. Their new priest was installed in January 2022.

Here is food for thought for our Vestry from the discussion with Kirt and Jeff:

- Search Committee members met with the Vestry to present the strengths and weaknesses of short-listed candidates and to officially wrap up the Search Committee's phase of the process.
- Vestry members digested each candidate's application portfolio and viewed available online homilies.
- Candidates and their partners visited St. Wilfred's for a weekend and toured the area with an unbiased, non-parishioner real estate agent to learn about local housing options and costs.
- Wardens and Treasurer met with each candidate to review the parish budget in detail, providing full transparency into expenses vs. income.
- Extensive Vestry team interviews concluded with a celebration of the Eucharist including a homily.
- Vestry prioritized criteria from the parish profile and "graded" each candidate to reach a decision.
- St. Wilfrid's final agreement stipulates that the rector live within 30 minutes of the parish campus.


