





Music Notes by Ray Urwin

Today's anthem and Offertory hymn were both composed by Orlando Gibbons (1583-1625), one of the greatest English musicians of his time, along with Thomas Tallis and William Byrd. As a boy Gibbons sang in the choir of King's College, Cambridge, and later served as organist of both the Chapel Royal and Westminster Abbey. He wrote many anthems, services, vocal, instrumental, sacred and secular music, and has ten hymns in our hymnal. In 1625 he traveled with the Chapel Royal to Canterbury for the reception of King Charles I's new bride, but while there he suddenly died, and was buried in Canterbury Cathedral. This anthem has been a standard of the Anglican choral repertoire almost since it was written: manuscripts of it are found in many cathedral and college chapel libraries of its time, and it was especially popular in the second half of the 17th century. The beautiful words of our offertory hymn were written by Matthew Bridges, a 19th century poet who converted to Catholicism due to the Oxford Movement.

Today we sing a different Alleluia, to a beautiful Irish tune known as *Salley Gardens*, along with organ music based on it to further familiarize us with it.


