



Music Notes by Ray Urwin

Today's anthem text is attributed to St. Richard of Chichester. Richard of Wyche (c. 1197-1253) served as Chancellor of Oxford University and later became Bishop of Chichester. Known as the "laughing bishop," he was said to be of strong character, kind, and modest about his own abilities. He loved people, was greatly loved by them, and was made a saint in 1262. "Day by day" is from a longer text. It appeared in hymnals (including ours, at Hymn 654) beginning in the early 20th century, and became a part of popular culture from the 1971 musical *Godspell*. Today's voluntary is part of the Eight Little Preludes and Fugues formerly attributed to J. S. Bach, but now thought to be by Johann Krebs, one of his most important students.

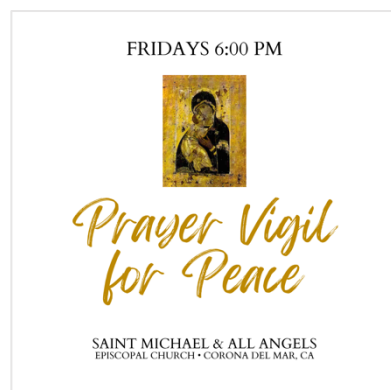

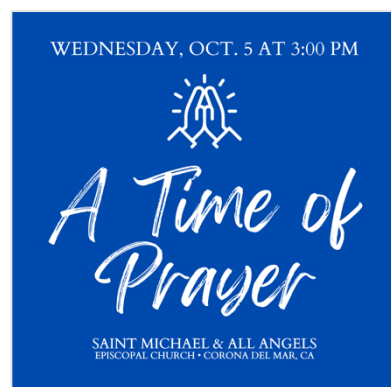
