NOW CONCERNING SPIRITUAL GIFTS, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says “Let Jesus be cursed!” and no one can say “Jesus is Lord” except by the Holy Spirit.

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. ON THE THIRD DAY there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Stewardship Update

2021

Pledge Income was \$272,237, only \$3,762.08 short of the annual budget of \$276,000.

2022

We received \$259,541.36 in pledges towards our goal of \$290,000, which is 89% of the goal.

We have 55 renewals and, encouragingly, 8 new pledge units for 2022, for a total of 63 pledge units. However, 55 of 86 pledges from last year were renewed, which means 31 pledges have not yet renewed. Please be assured that it is never too late to submit your pledge for 2022, either on-line or by mail.

The Finance Committee and Vestry have worked diligently to draft the 2022 budget, based on the pledges we have received. Thank you to everyone who has given so faithfully and generously as we all strive to be good stewards of the resources given to our care, becoming part of God's mission in the world.

Music Notes, by Ray Urwin



Today's Offertory music by the American composer and teacher Daniel Pinkham is based on a 19th century hymn tune from the American South. The Prelude by the renowned and beloved French composer Maurice Duruflé is based on the plainsong for the Introit for the Feast of the Epiphany and is in his usual brooding, contemplative, serious style. Both pieces have the same timbre, with the melodies in the tenor vocal range, rather than the usual soprano.
