



The Lessons

FIRST READING: Genesis 15:1-12, 17-18

Reader A Reading from the book of Genesis.

The word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision, "Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." ²But Abram said, "O Lord GOD, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?" ³And Abram said, "You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir." ⁴But the word of the LORD came to him, "This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir." ⁵He brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your descendants be." ⁶And he believed the LORD; and the LORD reckoned it to him as righteousness.

Then he said to him, "I am the LORD who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess." But he said, "O Lord GOD, how am I to know that I shall possess it?" He said to him, "Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtledove, and a young pigeon." He brought him all these and cut them in two, laying each half over against the other; but he did not cut the birds in two. And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away.

¹²As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell upon Abram, and a deep and terrifying darkness descended upon him.

¹⁷When the sun had gone down and it was dark, a smoking fire pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces. ¹⁸On that day the LORD made a covenant with Abram, saying, "To your descendants I give this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the river Euphrates."

You speak in my heart and say, "Seek my <u>face.</u>" Your face, Lord, will I <u>seek</u>. Hide not your <u>face</u> from me, nor turn away your servant in dis<u>pleasure</u>.

You have been my helper; cast me not a<u>way</u>; do not forsake me, O God of my sal<u>va</u>tion. Though my father and my mother for<u>sake</u> me, the Lord will sus<u>tain</u> me.

Show me your way, O <u>Lord</u>; lead me on a level path, because of my <u>en</u>emies. Deliver me not into the hand of my <u>ad</u>versaries, for false witnesses have risen up against me, and also those who speak <u>ma</u>lice.



Music Notes from Ray Urwin

Today's Prelude is by Ukrainian composer Myroslav Skoryk (1938-2020). Originally a piece for strings, it was transcribed for organ by a colleague in the Bay Area, who then sent it out to the national Association of Anglican Musicians earlier this week, with permission (and encouragement) to play in our services.

Today's Offertory music is an unusual offering, a duet sung by our male section leaders. It was composed by the early Baroque composer Heinrich Schütz (1585-1672), much of whose career spanned the Thirty Years' War (1618-1648), which ravaged much of Europe and especially Germany, in which some areas lost half or more of their population. Despite the privations Schütz managed to be quite prolific, writing a lot of music. Besides his own compositions and his many students, he was of crucial importance in bringing new musical ideas to Germany from Italy (where he had studied), and thus was a large influence on later German Baroque music. The famed North German organ school, which climaxed a century later with J. S. Bach, ultimately derives from Schütz. Like Palestrina he wrote little secular music, and is one of those great composers whose music is not heard enough in the church, for which he wrote virtually all his music. This duet is from his *Kleine Geistliche Konzerte* (Little Music Concerts), a large collection of sacred music for smaller resources, i.e. for churches and royal courts whose resources and personnel were decimated by the war. Whether in German or English, the duet words are two of the more beautiful and sublime verses of the Bible, verses 5 and 6 of Psalm 27, today's psalm.

Finally, hymn tunes are eclectic and come from various sources, historical times, and occasions. The tune of our Offertory hymn was written by the Baroque composer Jeremiah Clarke, organist at St. Paul's and composer of the famous Trumpet Voluntary often used as wedding processionals. Today's Sequence Hymn was originally a 16th century French Christmas carol!
